Buffalo, NY — TRIMANIA is back! After a seven-year hiatus, TRIMANIA\_REBOOT returns on March 29, 2025, at Tri-Main Center with an impressive entertainment list to make up for lost time. The event is put on by Buffalo Arts Studio—the first tenant at Tri-Main Center back in 1991. TRIMANIA is the Studio's only major fundraiser for 2025.

TRIMANIA\_REBOOT is an epic celebration of art, culture, and music that transforms the six-floor building into a night of music, art, and energy, featuring live bands, DJs, dancers, poets, visual artists, and performers of all kinds to build your own adventure. Some highlights for this year's event include:

• Art Exhibitions: Featuring the work of Jay Carrier and 30 Studio Artists at Buffalo Arts Studio and dozens more in open suites.

- Live Painting and Mural Making: Watch creativity in action as Chuck Tingley, AJ Fries, Bianca L. McGraw, Bree Gilliam, Laura Valkwitch, and Solo Roths paint live.
- **Musical Performances:** Experience dynamic performers like Medusa, MYQ Farrow Acoustic Trio, Letter to Elise, tuesday nite, Diyené, and Ribbit Exhibit on multiple stages.
- Interactive Art: Join Madeline Bartley, Miggie Wong, Explore Buffalo, and In-Room Plus! for hands-on creativity.
- **Fashion and Dance:** Don't miss SE2 Silent Disco, Buffalo Fashion Runway, Glam Vamps, Buffalo Flow Collective, Devi Performing Arts, and performances by Buffalo Improv House.
- **Special Features:** Explore micro-galleries curated by Julia Bottoms, Stitch Buffalo, Hallwalls, and Hunt Gallery, as well as digital installations from Squeaky Wheel Film & Media Art Center, Buffalo Game Space, and Fret Zealot.

Musical and dance performances will span the diverse spectrum of Western New York talent; belly dancing, Irish dancing, aerial dance, and comedy will take place alongside jazz, hip-hop, and even an Americana Blues room curated by Sportsmen's Americana Music Foundation.

The event also provides an opportunity to explore the vast Tri-Main Center, which spans two city blocks and 575,000 square feet on six floors. The former Ford Motor Plant, designed in 1915 by American architect Albert Kahn, now houses over 100 spaces specially suited for a diverse community of thinkers, doers, inventors, activists, and artists. As guests take in the people, performers, and installations, they can explore the artist studios, creative businesses, and community organizations housed inside Tri-Main Center.
