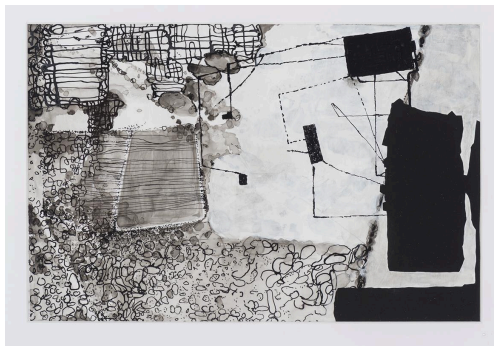

## Buffalo Arts Studio announces the Summer 2022 Exhibitions



### **Jim Morris, *On the Nature of Things*, June 24 – August 8, 2022**

#### **Opening Reception, Friday, June 24, 2022, 5:00–8:00 pm (Part of M&T 4th Fridays at Tri-Main Center)**

Jim Morris's work explores how dynamic real-world events can be visualized to capture states of volatility, turbulence, and transformation. Morris focuses on themes of power and flux as he searches print and digital sources for examples of the myriad ways in which information is visualized to communicate the dynamism of events – the spread of a virus within a community, the porosity of a disputed border between hostile states. Morris's drawings manipulate the images by reorganizing and re-presenting the visual information to draw out and amplify qualities that he sees concealed within the graphics and the cognitive assumptions he is interrogating.



### **Kyle Butler, *Big Trash Day*, July 22–September 3, 2022**

Kyle Butler shifts his process and materials from one series to the next, moving between image-based painting and process-based installation work. In much of the work, the built environment draws attention to the interplay of competing and cooperating systems as well as the limitations of those systems;. Much of his work is rooted in an artist-made map of all the dead end streets of Buffalo, NY. The map organizes this common utilization of urban space as a visual system as well as an allegory for failed policy.
